



On 12th of October ENTELIS+ Consortium partners organised the Final Conference of the project titled #Righttoconnectnow – accessibility session with networking drinks in EASPD's 25th Anniversary Conference in Thon Hotel EU at Brussels. The main objective of the first part of the session was to showcase the training modules prepared by the consortium partners and discuss the on-ground experience of the pilot training in 4 countries (Italy, Austria, Ireland and Greece) with the target group. In the second part of the session, ENTELIS+ partners disseminated different outputs including success factors, mapping of good practice, fact sheets etc. as well as promoted the #RightToConnectNow campaign.

Luk Zelderloo, Secretary General, <u>EASPD</u> opened the session with a welcome speech highlighting the importance of strategic public and private partnerships to develop innovative methods and practices to foster inclusive education as well as enhancing the digital skills and competences of digitally excluded groups particularly persons with disabilities of all ages. Evert-Jan Hoogerwerf Secretary General, AAATE shared the key objectives of the ENTELIS+ project and the ENTELIS Network.

Ilaria Valoti from <u>AIAS Bologna Onlus</u> moderated the panel session where panel speakers Sarah Gavra Boland (<u>Saint John of God Community Services</u>), Aaron Reitbauer (<u>atempo Betriebsgesellschaft</u> mbH), Elli Kafritsa (<u>Vocational Training Centre MARGARITA</u>), Sofia Ceré (<u>AIAS Bologna Onlus</u>) shared on-ground experience of conducting accessibility training to service provider of person with disabilities in Austria, Ireland, Greece and Italy using the training module prepared by the consortium.

In addition, on 13th of October a separate workshop was organised where the consortium partner <u>FUNKA</u> facilitated a training on digital accessibility and how to provide training on digital accessibility to persons with disability. Total 40+ participants across Europe attended the workshop.
